Volunteers must be credentialed before deployment.

Mission of the Month - Personal Preparedness Plan

Personal Preparedness Plan: Each individual should have a personal/family preparedness plan in place. This is required for Medical Reserve Corps volunteers. This includes having food, clothing and shelter supplies for a minimum of 3 days. It also includes having emergency telephone numbers posted. Volunteers should have a personal travel bag ready in case of deployment. Please visit the following websites for additional information on having a personal preparedness plan

Recommended Items to include in an Emergency Supply Kit: Water, food, infant care items, pet food, can opener, mess kits, prescription and non prescription medicines, thermometer, personal sanitation, bleach, matches, portable radio, flashlight, watch or battery operated clock, first aid kit, duct tape, tools, fire extinguisher.

Additional Items to Consider adding: important documents, cash or travelers checks, first aid book, sleeping bag, change of clothes, books, games.

Planning For an Emergency: make sure your family has a plan, post emergency numbers, determine family emergency contact information.


the Bureau of Communicable Disease Control for the Massachusetts Department of Public Health and State Epidemiologist for Massachusetts.
